Wayside marker to spotlight Pine Street's musical heritage

Pine Street will see a new historic wayside marker later this year, thanks to a \$3,000 mini-grant awarded to Cambridge Main Street from the Heart of Chesapeake Country Heritage Area. Main Street will match the grant. This marker will include highlights of Greene's Opera House and other spots on Pine Street that hosted such musicians as Chick Webb, Noble Sissle, and Count Basie in the early and mid-20th century. If all goes well, Main Street will apply for a larger grant in the future to create more markers and a brochure.
